

The Sheffield City Council Special Session was called to order at Sheffield City Hall by Mayor Scott Sanders, at 6:30PM on Monday, June 22nd, 2020. Council Members in attendance were Jill Peterson, Nick Wilson, Dave Smit (via telephone), Brad Mulford. James Robbins was absent, but joined the meeting at 6:50PM. Also, in attendance was; Pat Nuehring, Public Works Director and Brad Gardner, Police Chief

Mayor Sanders led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda and Mulford seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Sanders announced that it was the time and place for the public comment time. There was none.

Mayor Sanders opened the Public Hearing pertaining to the FY2020 Budget Amendment #4 at 6:34PM. There was no comment, so he closed the hearing at 6:35PM.

Peterson motioned to approve the list of claims presented. Mulford seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously.

New Business

- There was brief discussion regarding the proposed rules and regulations for the 2020 Swimming Pool Season. Mayor Sanders, Councilman Smit, the city clerk, public works director, and pool manager all got together to determine a list of rules, regulations, and fees in light of COVID-19. These were the recommendations being made. Councilman Smit is concerned about opening because social distancing can't be maintained. There was discussion of the resident vs non-resident fee prices. A few changes were made to such.
- Mulford made a motion to approve a resolution adopting Sheffield Swimming Pool 2020 Season Rules, Regulations & Fees. Peterson seconded the motion and roll call vote was as follows, Ayes: Peterson, Wilson, Mulford, Robbins; Nays: Smit. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 20-54. Opening day will be Friday, June 26th.
- One bid was received to repair concrete on 255th Street from C5 Construction. Mulford motion to approve the bid, Robbins seconded the motion and it was approved with Wilson abstaining due to conflict of interest.
- Brief discussion over FY2020 Budget Amendment #4. Smit mentioned that given the state of the general fund, he was disappointed that the library hadn't utilized unemployment for employee's vs paying them full hours from their standard budget. Wilson then made a motion to approve a resolution approving the amendment. Mulford seconded the motion and roll call vote was as follows, Ayes: Peterson, Wilson, Smit, Mulford, Robbins. Mayor Sanders declared the resolution approved, adopted, and numbered 20-55.
- Mayor Sanders presented an information resolution from IPIB between the City and Josh Baker. Smit motioned to approve the resolution as presented, Robbins seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Council Comments – Mayor Sanders let the council know that the city is waiting for a quote from Heartland Asphalt to resurface and correct issues at Brickyard Road.

Mulford motioned to adjourn, Peterson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Adjournment at 7:05PM.
